Using a ‘window frame’, choose a section of a Carr painting that shows movement, sketch this in the gallery and then add colour.

June 18 – Large Skies

Some of Carr’s later paintings show lots of sky. Experiment with using a range of material and paper sizes to create your own drawing that focuses on the sky.

June 25 – Large Scale Forest Drawing

Using your own body for scale, create a tree to add to the growing forest.

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
